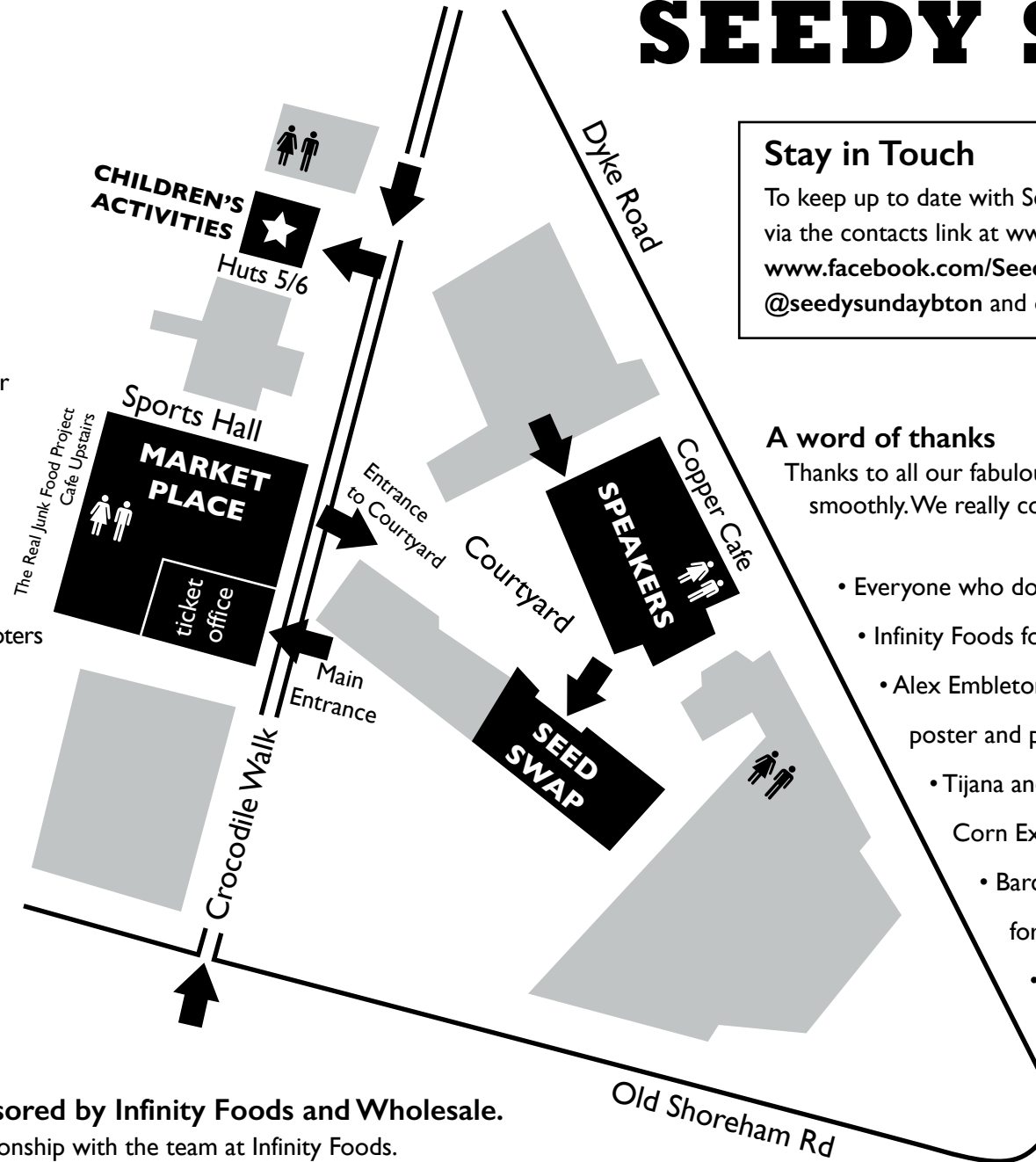


Infinity Foods
